We are thrilled to announce the opening of several new restaurants and shops in downtown La Grange.

Prasino's, at 93 S. La Grange Road, will feature an organic and locally grown menu serving breakfast, lunch and dinner. The owners have begun their environmentally friendly restaurant build-out, and plan to open November 15.

Nickson's Eatery, a full-service restaurant featuring regional American cuisine, will be opening soon at 30 S. La Grange Road,

Di Nico's and Gelato Uno will be opening at 42-44 S. La Grange Road (next to Starbucks) and will feature pizza and gelato.

Murphy's Dog House at 76B S. La Grange Road (behind the theater) opened recently and features hot dogs, beef sandwiches, polish sausage and fries.

Q BBQ, brought to you by the owners of Roly Poly, is a new barbeque restaurant at 70 S. La Grange Road, which will feature smoked meats, homemade rubs and sauces, and a variety of side dishes.

Mambo Room Latin Grill, formerly La Pinta, has opened at 25 W. Calendar with a new décor and exciting menu. The restaurant features tapas style dining with a Latin flair.

Toscana's Grill will be coming to 88 S. La Grange Road by the end of the year. Plans call for a casual family restaurant offering Italian specialties.

Kama - India Bistro will be opening at 8 W. Burlington, just south of the La Grange Road train station.

We also welcome three other food-oriented establishments: Sweetness candy store at 21 S. La Grange Road, From Scratch Bakery at 26 W. Calendar, and Summer Chill at 114 W. Calendar, which features frozen yogurt and beverages.
